JCC Camp Daleville is located 15 minutes from Scranton in rural Daleville, Pennsylvania and is operated by the JCC of Scranton. For more than 50 years, our beautiful 100-acre site has been the perfect setting for children to learn new skills, build relationships and make lasting memories. We offer programs for campers from preschool age through eighth grade and an exciting Counselor in Training (CIT) program.

Campers are grouped by age/grade and enjoy a wide variety of age appropriate programs, field trips and special days. Campers will discover new activities, improve skills, and build confidence and self esteem in an outstanding environment with great facilities that include: a heated in-ground swimming pool, a 20-acre lake, basketball & volleyball courts, ball fields, tetherball courts, playgrounds, an archery range, a mini-golf area, hiking trails, an auditorium with stage, picnic pavilion, arts and crafts center and more! Our boys and girls locker rooms provide clean changing areas and ample storage for bags and belongings during activities.

We encourage campers to learn inter-personal skills, achieve personal growth and gain a sense of independence. Safe, supervised transportation to/from camp from designated locations in Clark Summit and Scranton is included in the JCC Camp Daleville tuition.

### PARENT INFORMATION

#### Fees

Camp tuition payment must be made in full prior to June 1, 2020. No refunds will be issued after June 1, 2020. Families that enroll at least two children will receive a sibling discount. The 2nd child receives a \$20 sibling discount. The third and each successive camper receives a \$30 sibling discount.

#### **Early Bird Discount**

For full-season campers only. Issue a \$100 non-refundable deposit, per child, on or prior to February 3rd to receive \$100 off the camp fee for each child.

#### **Scholarship**

Every child should have the opportunity to experience a fantastic summer at JCC Camp Daleville. The JCC offers a scholarship program to help families in financial need. If you wish to apply for scholarship, or payment plans, please do so by April 15, 2020. Scholarship forms are available at the JCC front office or you may download our scholarship procedures and application on our website at campdaleville.org. Scholarship decisions are determined by our Camp Scholarship Committee.

#### **T-Shirts**

All campers will be given a FREE JCC Camp Daleville t-shirt to be worn on special event days and all field trips. Remember to circle the proper size of your child's t-shirt on the registration form.



### **Medical Form**

Parents are required to provide a completed and signed medical form for each child. This form is included in this brochure. Each registered camper must have his/her own health insurance coverage.

#### **Transportation**

Camp Daleville provides transportation to and from camp from several convenient locations, including the Scranton JCC, St. Gregory's Church in Clarks Summit, Pen-Y-Bryn Drive, and Roaring Brook Estates. We may also pick up at selected points in the Pocono area based on a minimum registration. Campers should be at their bus stop by 8:50 am. The bus departs camp at 4:30 pm and all campers must be picked up by 5:15 pm.

#### Early Drop-Off & Late Pick-Up

JCC Camp Daleville offers an early drop-off (8:00 -8:30 am at the Scranton JCC or 8:30 am - 9:00 am at Camp Daleville) for a \$25/week fee per child and a late pick-up at the Scranton JCC (until 5:45 pm), for a \$25/week fee per each child. Please pre-register for early drop-off &/or late pick-up before camp starts.

#### **Lunch & Snacks**

Campers may bring their own lunch, which will be refrigerated upon arrival at camp. Camp Daleville provides all beverages, snacks and food for cookouts and overnight meals. We also offer a kosher lunch five days per week for an additional fee. Prices and menus will be emailed weekly.

#### **Camp Committee**

Our Camp Committee is comprised of a group of dedicated, active, volunteers who work hand in hand with the professional leadership of the camp to ensure the best possible camp experience for our campers. Committee members bring a range of expertise and tremendous enthusiasm to the camp. Middle School is a time of change, and camp is no different. In addition to participating in traditional camp activities and field trips, the Voyager group embarks on two (2) three-day overnight field trips.

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We recognize at this age they want to be more than just campers. This program allows our CITs that freedom along with a healthy dose of responsibility. Our CITs get hands-on experience working with our younger campers and leadership training that focuses on teamwork, communication, cooperation, responsibility, patience and respect. CITs work independently to schedule their own peer-related activities, including the CIT camp overnight and field trip.

### SPECIALTY CAMPS

**HORSEBACK RIDING CAMP** One week, one-hour/day specialty camp located at Windy Hill Stables. Campers are taught riding, horsemanship, and grooming. Transportation to/from Windy Hill Stables is provided. Horseback Riding Specialty Camp is offered in both Sessions I and II. *Cost \$200/week* 

**ROBOTICS CAMP** One week, one hour/day specialty camp for campers 8 years and older (Trailblazer and up). Robotics gives campers the opportunity to dive deeper into the world of STEM. Campers should come prepared to design, build, and use their creativity to think outside the box. Robotics camp is offered in both Sessions I and II. *Cost \$150/week* 

**COOKING SPECIALTY CAMP** One week, 1 hour/day specialty camp for campers 6 years and older (Pioneer and up). Make delicious snacks, learn basics about cooking and more! All recipes and cooking will be age appropriate. Cooking Specialty Camp is offered in both Sessions I and II. *Cost \$150/week* 

### SUNSHINE CONNECTIONS

Sunshine Connections is a comprehensive summer day camp program for children 3-13 years old who have been diagnosed with autism. All participants must be accompanied by a TSS worker. This program maximizes your child's opportunity for growth recreationally, socially and functionally. Your child will develop social skills and friendships with traditional campers, and become successful and welcome members of our camp community. Activities consist of therapeutic games and recreational activities.
